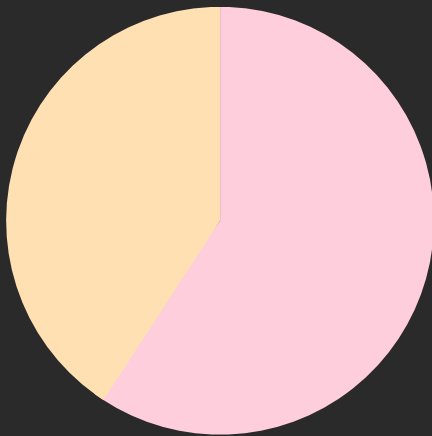
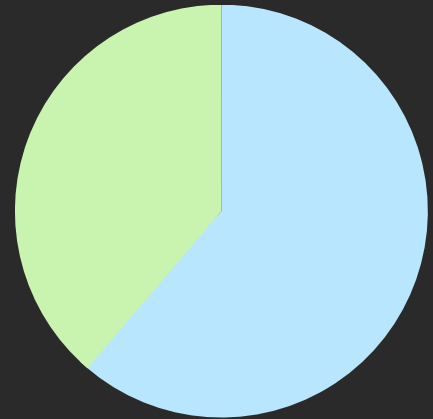

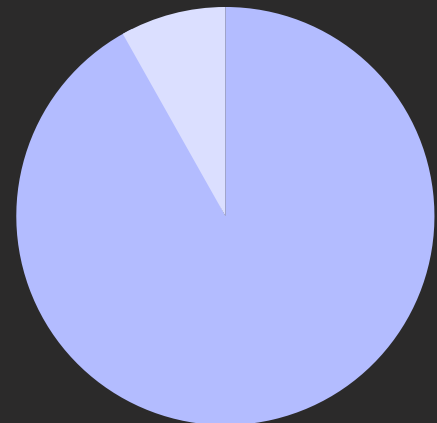
BREAKDOWN OF ALL 49 CHAPTERS BY TYPE

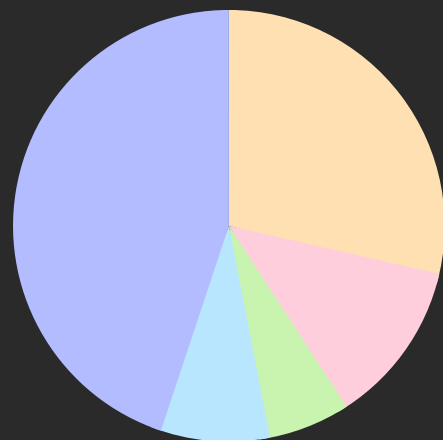

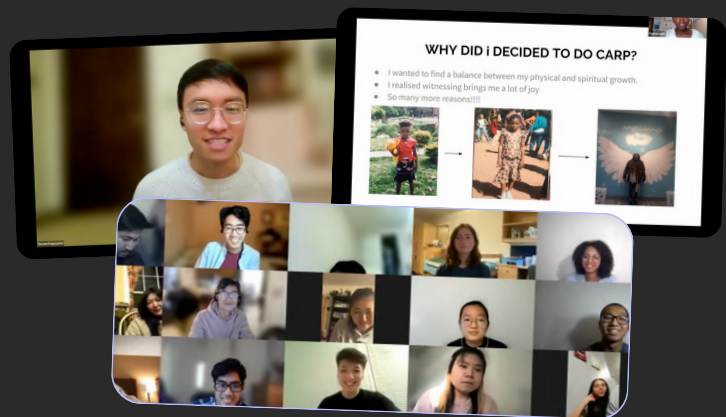

LOCAL DIRECTORS' RETREAT

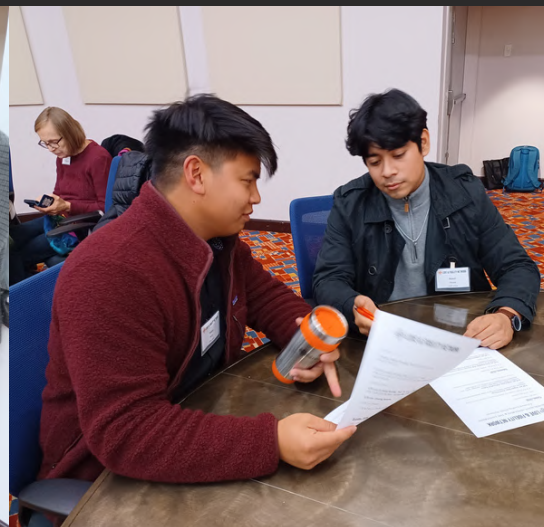

LOVE & FIDELITY NETWORK

National CARP sponsored representatives to spend a weekend in Princeton, New Jersey from October 28th - 29th for an annual conference hosted by the Love & Fidelity Network (LFN) called Sexuality, Integrity, and the University (SIU). CARP has been attending SIU conferences annually and building partnerships with LFN staff and presenters for over five years. This year, ten CARP students and six CARP non-student supporters attended.





NEW HOPE HJ PILGRIMAGE

On July 25th - 31st, 23 CARP students and staff from throughout the US went to Korea for the 2023 New Hope HJ Pilgrimage, traveling all over South Korea to understand and experience the history and heart of CARP Founders, Rev. Moon and Dr. Moon, based on the theme "Experience the Footsteps of True Parents."





NEW HOPE HJ PILGRIMAGE

The pilgrimage went from the DMZ in the north to Busan in the south, from the simple Korean countryside near Gongju to the urban capital of Seoul, from the humble beginnings of Father Moon's ministry of Beom-net-gol to the magnificent palace of the Cheon-Jeong-Gung.

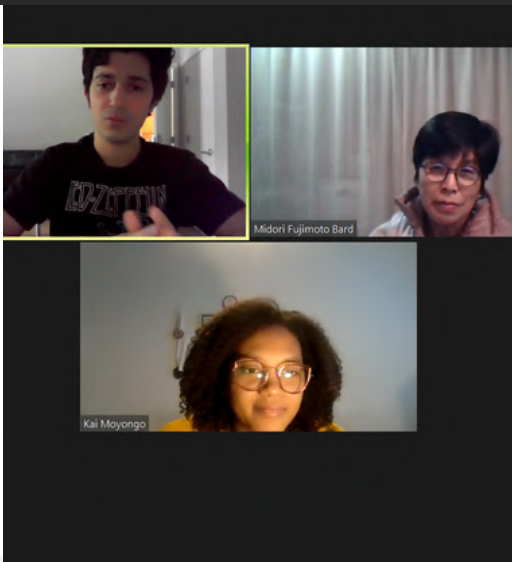


LOCAL PROGRAMS
